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

received, your Compost tag for 2023 will be mailed to you prior to the site opening.

Dumping leaves and/or brush in the forested areas and outlots of Legend Lake is prohibited by both State and County laws. To avoid penalties of this kind, use the Compost Site operated by the Association for the convenience of its members.

Leaves must be emptied from plastic bags and the bags taken with you. Do not place branches in the leaves. The attendant on duty will determine the acceptance or rejection of any materials in question.

Brush brought to the site is chipped and is available to members in good standing. Since the chips and compost (black dirt) are quite popular, we request that you take only what you will use on your property at Legend Lake. Quantities may be limited, at discretion of the Compost manager.

Grass clippings must be spread out – not left in clumps or piles. Separate pine from hardwoods and place in appropriate piles. Brush over 4" is to be placed in the camp fire wood pile.

#### ---Very Important Reminders----

The LLPOA compost was originally established as a convenience and source of recycled materials to LLPOA members. Its use has grown over the years, and more and more members have been taking advantage of the site. Occasionally, we have to remind our members of simple guidelines:

1. Materials must be divided into categories and separated into those categories in order to provide the most effective and efficient use of the site.

<sup>\*</sup>Attention: Compost Site Manager has the option to vary the schedule due to weather conditions. Call the Lodge for verification if weather conditions are questionable. 715/799-3317

- 2. Materials such as leaves, grass, sea weed and such are set aside so as to provide a source of recycled materials such as mulch, fertilizer and top soil.
- 3. Wood and branches are divided into hardwood and softwood piles so as to be chipped according the grade and hardness of the wood. As such, individuals depositing branches need to unload the branches in one of the two category piles: hardwood such as oak and softwood such as pine.
- **4.** Only live, fresh, woody materials are capable of being chipped. Dead and dry woody materials need to be loaded into the burn area (large burn pit) where they will be burnt during the wet, snowy season under the supervision of an attendant and the DNR.
- 5. Wet and rotted materials and tree stumps cannot be included due to the slow burn rates and the tendency to simmer rather than burn. Please do not bring such materials to the compost site or you may be asked to leave.
- **6.** The chipper is limited as to the diameter of the wood/branches that can be chipped. That diameter cannot exceed 4 inches. Any branches, trunks or wood materials exceeding the 4 inch diameter need be sawn before arriving at the site and upon arrival, deposited on the firewood pile.
- 7. Finally, please remember that the area is a COMPOST SITE established for the recycling of recyclable materials, not a dumping area for unwanted goods such as construction materials and garbage.

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




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#### **CHAIRMAN'S REPORT**

August 2023

Hello Lake District Members,

WOW! Where has the summer gone? As I sit down to write this letter in the second half of August, I'm seeing a few tree leaves starting to fall and/or turn color. Time is going too fast for me these days. In mid to late September the Lake water temperatures will start the process of turning over. I found an article titled, COOL FACTS about LAKE TEMPS by Jordyn Kurer a UW-Stevens Point Graduate in the Lake Tides quarterly publication. This article explains in simple detail how the water temperatures are coldest in the deep water in the Summer and coldest temps in Winter are found on the top of the Lake. I'm including this article again this year as how the lake temperatures turn over as a reminder for everyone and for our new lake members this year. The article is attached to this letter for you to read.

This year we treated 46.6 acres of EWM/HWM with an herbicide called ProcellaCOR in the dense and moderately dense areas. Most of these areas were in channels which was impeding navigation. This treatment is the smallest treatment in many years in our fight to contain EWM/HWM. The results were very good and allowed the native plants to grow and become more prolific.

In addition to the treatment the Lake District crew has been out harvesting EWM/HWM and aquatic plants in heavy navigational areas of our Lake System. All three machines are actively being used and working well. They are also looking for Eurasian/Hybrid Watermilfoil (EWM/HWM) growth and are concentrating on the Dense and Moderately Dense areas for harvesting. Since it is late August, we will only have four or five weeks of harvesting left before the machines will be pulled out of the lake, cleaned thoroughly, and maintained for Winter storage. There work doesn't stop there since they will be pulling buoys and docks from the Lake which need to be cleaned and maintained as well. The Lake District crew does a great job keeping our Lake System clean and open for all water activities.

We our seeing less milfoil this year and a comeback of more Native Aquatic Plants which is great for our Lake System. I hope this trend continues for a while. We will be checking for any increases in Curly Leaf Pondweed growth in the Spring 2024 when the ice goes out. Otherwise, the Board is very pleased with the containment of AIS species in our lake system. Our new aquatic ecologist, Onterra LLC, will be completing a summer survey for EWM/HWM in late August or early September. The Board will be reviewing the survey data and maps for possible spot treatments next year focusing on the Moderately Dense and Dense areas again as we have the past couple of years.

Lisa Wilson our Dam Inspector has been actively checking the Dams monthly and has reported that they our in good shape. The water level is below the normal level for this time of the year. She reports any issues for cleaning and maintenance to Arland/Steve or his crew for the work to be completed.

We had a successful Boater's Safety Class led by Sue Thoma and many volunteers this year in June. The 34 kids were eager to learn about the rules and regulations of the State of Wisconsin and our Legend Lake. It was nice to see all the smiles on their faces as they participated in the water activities day with the different water vessels and activities.

In mid-August we had a Lake Faire led by Kristin Allen and Karen Dillenburg on a beautiful summer day with a slight breeze. We had the fish tank with Sturgeon, Northern, Panfish and a turtle in it. Ryan Wehse from the Environmental Services Department of the Tribe was on hand to answer questions regarding the fish. There were many activities for the kids with prizes for everyone. A Petting Zoo of animals was available for viewing and petting which was monitored by the 4-H group from Shawano. Educational materials were on hand for identifying Aquatic Invasive Plant Species with actual samples and Clean Boat Clean Water information. The Sheriff's Department K-9 unit were on hand to answer any questions regarding Boat Patrol, our community etc. Deputy Ruger was there for viewing and gave us a demonstration how he helps track down people and help his fellow officers. The War Bonnet provided food, drinks and there were many other vendors explaining and displaying their wares. I believe everyone enjoyed themselves.


The Fishing Committee has been active this

year. We our having another meeting in late August to tour the Walleye rearing ponds with Ryan Wehse the Tribe Fisheries Biologist giving us the tour. The committee is planning on Walleye stocking again this year. Musky stocking is also being planned if the DNR can get the Great Lakes Spotted Strain of Muskies. More updates will follow in the next Smoke Signals edition.

The Responsible Safe Boating committee has been actively coming up with new ways to communicate Boating Responsibly on Legend Lake. Through education and communication, they are promoting the protection of our Shorelines and each other as we use various vessels, PWC's and other water recreational items. You'll find information regarding safe boating practices, lake etiquette and behaviors that protect our shoreline is available in a variety of locations: At boat launches, Legend Lake website, Announcements in the Smoke Signals and Legend Lake Community Facebook page. The RBC committee also had several videos made displaying boating rules and safety practices that all boat operators should follow. Three of them were shown at the Lake District annual meeting this year. Kristin Allen is doing a great job heading up this committee and continues to look for more ways and ideas to promote boating safety and protect our shorelines. If you have any ideas, please feel free to call her or the Lodge office with your ideas.

The Lake District Board has been asked to remind Lake District Members again this year about unpermitted Buoys. Clark Delzer-Conservation Warden-Bureau of Law Enforcement, Wisconsin Department of Natural resources while on patrol on Legend



Lake recently, observed properties that have permanent buoys placed in front of their properties. He assumed the buoys were placed to deter boat traffic from operating faster than slow-no-wake within 200' of their shoreline. He also observed some makeshift "swim areas" that some residents have marked with permanent buoys. While he understands their motives, it is not legal to place permanent structures in a lake without a permit. The Lake District has been asked to pass this information unto Lake Members and ask them to remove the unpermitted buoys. So, if you our one of these waterfront properties please remove your unpermitted buoys. Thank-you for removing them.

It's always a time of sadness for me having to pull everything out of the Lake and put it away for the Winter. That's the reality of the water turning over on Legend Lake.

Fall 2023

The summer is almost over and fall begins soon. We hope everyone enjoyed their summer on Legend Lake and continue enjoy themselves going into the fall season.

#### Patrol-

There continues to be suspicious activities reported around the lakes and wooded areas. We ask if you observe suspicious activity, report it to the Dispatch Center at 715-799-3881 or 911 for emergencies. Due to the increase of suspicious activities around the lake, security check patrols have increased. So far this year, deputies have performed 540 security checks which includes all shifts of the Sheriff's Office.

Our agency continues to have extra patrols for speed/ highway safety issues in several areas of the county. The Menominee County Sheriff's Office often participates in highway safety initiatives throughout the year such as Drive Sober and Click It or Ticket campaigns.

The Sheriff's Office continues to participate in monthly activities with Youth Services to help enhance our relationships with the area youth. Throughout the summer, law enforcement, EMS and Fire participate in monthly events which included a Softball game night, Kickball game night, and Teen night. Youth Services will continue to host events throughout the year.

Boat patrol- The Sheriff's Office hired one boat patrol deputy for the summer. In August, the deputy was hired as a full-time patrol deputy. For the remainder of the season, deputies may cover boat patrol on overtime.

There has been much confusion on jurisdiction on Legend Lake with alleged violations. The Menominee County Sheriff's Office does not have jurisdiction to cite or arrest tribal members of a federally recognized US tribe. If there are violations on the lake, please call the Dispatch Center at 715-799-3881 to report violations. A deputy or tribal conservation warden will address violations. There are laws for boating with tribal members. To get familiar with the laws, visit the Menominee Indian Tribe of Wisconsin website and view the E-Codes under the government portion of the website.

#### New/ Outgoing Personnel-.

We would like to welcome Jeff Krause to the Menominee County Sheriff's Office. Deputy Krause started with our agency in June, 2023. Deputy Krause has prior law enforcement experience with the Menominee Tribal Police Department.

We would like to also welcome James Watson to our team. Deputy Watson is a fresh recruit from NWTC. Deputy Watson started with our agency as a boat patrol deputy and was promoted to full-time patrol deputy in late July, 2023.

Deputy Joseph Faucett resigned from our agency in August, 2023. We wish Deputy Faucett well with his future in law enforcement in Marinette County.

MESO currently has an opening for one full-time position in the dispatch center.



Menominee County Landowners,

My name is Alex Forster, I am the new Land Conservation/Forestry/Zoning (CFZ) Assistant-Technician and Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS) Coordinator for Menominee County. I've had the pleasure of getting to meet some of you as I've gone along with Jeremy over the summer doing oak injections, site evaluations, zoning checks, and other various field work. You may also recognize me as I was a field technician for Timberland Invasive Partnership (TIP) last year working out of the same office. I'm elated to be a permanent part of this department, meeting you, and getting to take part in the work that is being done through our department!

Part of my job as the AIS Coordinator for Menominee County is to help educate the public on aquatic invasive species that are in our county or may be a future threat to our area. **Purple Loosestrife** (*Lythrum salicaria*) is a wetland invasive plant with showy purple flowers that is native to Europe and Asia. Contaminated cargo ships along with deliberate importation of seeds caused the introduction of the species to the United States back in 1869. Although the beautiful purple flower spikes look harmless, this plant causes a devastating effect on our native biodiversity. This plant forms thick mats of roots that can spread over large areas degrading habitat for our native flora and fauna. How can you help? Learn how to identify purple loosestrife and other invasive species. Purple loosestrife can be identified by their square woody stems with opposite lance-shaped leaves. This time of year, they are in flower so be on the lookout for the long flower spikes with purple flowers. If you come across a small amount on your property it can be dug up or cutting the flower stalks before they go to seed can help ensure no further new plant growth. Make sure to bag up any plants you remove and dispose of them in the garbage. **DO NOT** compost or discard them in natural areas! Contact me to report purple loosestrife or for help identifying it.





Curly-leaf Pondweed (Potamogeton crispus) is another aquatic invasive that you may have seen within our lakes. This aquatic species forms extensive mats that impact recreation activities within bodies of water. Plants are submersed with alternate leaves that almost resemble lasagna noodles, they are wavy and have a very distinct serrated edge. Mechanical or hand harvesting can be done to help remove plant biomass. Thankfully our lake associations do a fantastic job of slowing and stopping the spread of this invasive in our beautiful lakes! You can also stop the spread of curly-leaf pondweed by inspecting your watercraft and removing aquatic plants and animals.



One last thing I also would like to mention is that oak cutting season is right around the corner. April 1<sup>st</sup> through October 1<sup>st</sup> you are prohibited from cutting, pruning or wounding oaks anywhere in the town/county with very few exceptions that require a permit. Please be aware no matter the reason you should stop by and fill out a permit, in some cases we may need to make a site visit for permit issuance. However, starting Oct. 2<sup>nd</sup> you can cut oaks without a permit. Keep in mind cutting of trees within 35 feet of any surface water has restrictions by shoreland zoning year-round. Oak cutting any time of year near a lake or river may not be allowed if the trees are not within your access corridor.

I hope you enjoy the rest of the season!

#### **Bishop's Goutweed Around Legend Lake**

Greetings Legend Lake Residents:

As the weather cools and trees begin to change, Timberland Invasives Partnership's (TIP) efforts to control invasive species will continue in the Legend Lake area. TIP works hard to prevent and control the spread of invasive species and you can also help prevent the spread. Please DO NOT throw leaves, roots, or yard debris into ditches or woods. Dumping yard debris is a common pathway for invasive species to spread.

One invasive plant that we have seen spreading from dumping yard debris is bishop's goutweed. Bishop's goutweed (*Aegopodium podagraria*), also known as snow-on-the-mountain, is a perennial, ornamental plant often used as groundcover. Bishop's goutweed is shade-tolerant and moisture loving, making forested environments the perfect habitat for spread. The ovate leaves are divided into groups of three and are solid or variegated in color. White, flat umbels of flowers form in late spring. Bishop's goutweed aggressively invades forests and ditches. As it spreads through rhizomes, it forms dense patches that outcompete native vegetation. Even small fragments of the plant can resprout and form new populations.

# Legend Lake Channel Kruisers' Snowmobile Club (LLCK)

What a year! We can only hope that 2023 brings us health and happiness and socialization. Perfect time to join the club if you haven't already done so. Last year snow conditions were a bit sketchy, let's hope for better conditions this year.

What is our club all about? The LLCK is a nonprofit snowmobile club that does not receive any state or local funding for our trail signage, construction or grooming. Our club membership is OPEN TO EVERY-ONE, not just Legend Lake Property Owners.

We currently have close to 100 families that are LLCK members. Please encourage everyone you know to join the club. I hope that everyone who uses our trail system becomes a club member, supports our sponsors and joins our social activities.

How much does the LLCK membership cost me? \$40 per family

Wait- there is more!

#### What does the LLCK membership dues provide me?

- If you are not a club member, a Wisconsin trail pass will cost you \$30 per sled.
- Being a LLCK club member reduces the cost of the Wisconsin trail pass from \$30 to \$10 per sled.
- Membership to The Association of Wisconsin Snowmobile Clubs (AWSC) which includes six issues of the Wisconsin Snowmobile News (WSN) magazine.
- Perfectly groomed trails right off of Legend Lake.

How do I become a member of the LLCK? Snow-mobile Club Membership forms are available on our web site at http://www.legendlakesnowmobileclub.com and can also be found at the Legend Lake Lodge. I've included a copy of the form at the

end of this article to make it even easier. The form includes instructions on where to mail your check and Snowmobile Club Interest Form.

Any LLCK membership application form or renewal received after December 20<sup>th</sup> will not be registered with the AWSC until after the Annual LLCK Election meeting held in October of each year. The membership registration will be sent into the AWSC monthly starting in October and ending the end of December.

Once I become a member of the LLCK and the AWSC, how do I get my trail pass for \$10 per sled? If you are currently a AWSC member, you can locate your AWSC membership number on the PRINTED address label on the cover of the WSN magazine, OR you can contact AWSC at 800-232-4108 OR you can go directly to their website at awsc@awsc. org. You may also call the WI DNR 7 days a week at 7am -10pm at 888-936-7463 for additional information. Call AWSE if you have not received the AWSC magazine.

<u>PLEASE NOTE!</u> A regular trail pass can be purchased at Wal-Mart, Fleet Farm, DNR Offices or Outlets selling hunting and fishing licenses for \$30 per sled if you are not a member of a snowmobile club and AWSC.

Plan to pay up to \$250 if you are stopped by the DNR or sheriff while riding without Wisconsin trail pass.

Starting fall 2020, the state will not mail your trail pass until they have received your AWSC dues. The state will need documentation on file that you have paid your dues in full before they will send you your trail pass.

#### **TRAIL NEWS**

Good news for LLCK! The state is funding Cecil Snowmobile Club for 5.9 miles of trails along Hwy R, Cty VV and Cty HH. We no longer have to pay grooming costs for the 5.9 miles mentioned above.

<u>Casino Trail:</u> Thank you, Dan Hedrich, for continuing to support the LLCK and maintaining a strong relationship with local snowmobile clubs and the Menominee Tribal Legislature.

This trail allows you to take a short ride (1.5 miles) from Legend Lake to the Casino and Fuel Station. The trail leaves Legend Lake at the boat landing by the Legend Lake Lodge. Go down South Branch Pathway to Hwy VV. Cross over Hwy VV and go up LaMotte Family

Road. The trail will go East down the old road bed until it gets to Go-Around Road. Continue to follow the marked trail all of way to the Menominee Casino. Follow the signs to the Menominee Fuel Station. The trail then crosses at the corner of Go-Around Rd and Hwy 47/55. You can park between the Casino Building and Hwy 47/55.

Please make an effort to visit the Casino. It is very important to show them you appreciate that they have allowed us to use their land. Even if you do not gamble, make a trip to the Casino for some food and beverages!

You can access the Shawano trail from the lodge or casino by following the signs along Go-Around Rd. The addition of the casino trail from Legend Lake provides a 30 to 40 miles loop from one end of Legend Lake and back to the other end via the Shawano County trails. This trail goes through a beautiful wooded area of Shawano and Menominee County. Well worth the trip.

Our trail from Legend Lake to Shawano Lake along Hwy HH is open all season to ride. You can still take a 20 to 30 mile ride even when the Shawano trails are closed. Don't forget to visit our sponsors around Shawano Lake. There are two access points to get on Shawano Lake. One is by taking the Fire Lane access off East Street to Washington Lake then crossing to Shawano Lake and the Other access is by going all the way Down East Street.

**Be careful if you go to Shawano Lake!** Stay off the channel that goes between Shawano Lake and Washington Lake. It never freezes. You can pick up a Shawano County trail map which includes Legends Lake at most local taverns for more information. Keep in mind that all lakes are never 100% safe. Ride with caution!

<u>Irail Grooming.</u> You can go to our Web Site http://www.legendlakesnowmobileclub.com to find out trail conditions and to link up to other great trail report web sites. Don't forget to thank our groomers for doing a great job.

Thank you to all who volunteered to help brush the trails after the annual meeting in October and then again after the heavy wet snows fell. Mark Stuyvenberg and Todd Lavey worked hard to keep the trails open – THANKS!!

There was a trail that went directly from lodge to the

War Bonnet last year. Jeff Dixon and Todd Lavey put that trail in and Jeff maintained it. We will talk with the War Bonnet owner and see if they want to maintain that trail again this year. If they do, they will be responsible for the maintenance of that trail as it is not a designated LLCK Trail. Go to the LLCK website for update.






